

Information on multiple mobilities in Erasmus+ programme

SGH International Centre announces that commencement of Erasmus+ programme entails a change in rules on participating in multiple mobility programmes:

In the new Erasmus+ programme, it is now possible to obtain funding for studying and conducting an internship abroad more than once. Students are able to study or conduct an internship abroad for a period not exceeding 12 months for each study cycle (Bachelor, Master and Doctoral level), irrespective of the type of mobility (studies or professional placement) and the number of mobility programmes (ex: two for a period of six months or three for a period of four months, etc.)

For students applying for Erasmus+ scholarships prior participation in Erasmus “Lifelong Learning” mobility programmes in the same study cycle will be taken into account. For example, if the student received a six-month grant through Lifelong Learning programme at Master study level, s/he will only be eligible for a scholarship lasting no longer than six months as a Master student. However, if the same student continues onto Doctoral studies, s/he will be eligible for a scholarship for a period of up to 12 months, as in this case the scholarship is at a different (higher) cycle of studies. Other mobility types, such as Leonardo Da Vinci internships through “Lifelong learning” program or European Voluntary Service through “Youth in Action” programme, will not be considered when calculating the maximum period of 12 months per each study cycle or professional placement in Erasmus+ programme.

Higher Education Institutions may give priority to students who have not benefitted from study abroad programmes in the past. Consequently, International Centre informs that students who have already received LLP Erasmus funding at their current study level in the past, will only be able to participate in the second (ancillary) selection round for Erasmus+ programmes. This stipulation pertains to students that already participated in an Erasmus programme who are applying for another mobility at the same study level and under the condition that the total length of mobility will not exceed 12 months.

In the case of Erasmus+ internships, all interested students are eligible to apply provided that the internship programme fulfils the specific conditions (eligible institution and country of internship, minimum length of 2 months, etc.). Students who have not benefitted from a mobility programme in the past will not be given priority.

However, students who have previously participated in mobility programmes through PIM or bilateral agreements will not be eligible to apply for Erasmus+ programme in the same study cycle.
